Louis Buckley to insure the equipment will meet the needs as envisioned. Mayor Masayko indicated for the record that the Sierra Forest Fire Protection District requires a levy of ten cents on the west side of Carson City. This is a special assessment for those particular properties. Supervisor Williamson moved to approve the Sierra Forest Fire Protection District Tentative Budget for Fiscal Year 2001-02. Supervisor Plank seconded the motion. Fire Chief Harvey indicated the ad valorem totals \$70,398. Supervisor Williamson expressed her hope that the Fire Service would not be busy this summer. The motion to approve the Tentative Budget for 2001-02 was voted and carried 5-0.

Fire Chief Harvey then explained that he was being reassigned and that this would be his last budget. He introduced his replacement Rob Ruffridge. Mr. Ruffridge explained his experience in Southern Nevada and indicated he was looking forward to working and living in this area. Mayor Masayko welcomed him and wished for a reasonable and safe fire season. He also wished Chief Harvey success in his new job and expressed the Board appreciation for his working with the City.

**ACTION TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION SETTING THE TAX RATE FOR COUNTY COOPERATIVE EXTENSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2001-02 (1-0168)** - Mayor Masayko indicated the ad valorem tax rate is 1.28 per \$100 of assessed value. Supervisor Plank moved to adopt Resolution No. 2001-R-22, A RESOLUTION SETTING THE TAX RATE FOR COUNTY COOPERATIVE EXTENSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2001-2002; fiscal impact is \$1.28 cents ad valorem; funding source is the Cooperative Extension Fund Budget. Mayor Masayko reiterated that the fiscal impact is 1.28 cents and not \$1.28 cents. Supervisor Plank amended his motion to be 1.28 cents ad valorem. Supervisor Livermore seconded the motion. Supervisor Williamson complimented Extension Director Joann Skelly, who was present, and her staff on the service they provide to the community. She also noted that Farm Days are this weekend at Fuji Park and wished her a successful event. The motion to adopt Resolution No. 2001-R-22 was voted and carried 5-0.

**ACTION TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION TO LEVY THE CARSON CITY FISCAL YEAR 2001-02 AD VALOREM TAX RATE AS CERTIFIED BY THE NEVADA TAX COMMISSION (1-0210)** - Discussion indicated the City's operating rate would be increased by 3.1 cents over last year's rate. Mr. Heath highlighted the rate changes. Supervisor Livermore moved to adopt Resolution No. 2001-R-23, A RESOLUTION TO LEVY THE CARSON CITY FISCAL YEAR 2001-02 AD VALOREM TAX RATE AS CERTIFIED BY THE NEVADA TAX COMMISSION, and that the rate is \$2.5807. Supervisor Williamson seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

**ACTION TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES OF FUNDS TO NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2001-02 (1-0240)** - Discussion noted that the expenditures listed were as had been established by the Board and had included CATF. The total for the next fiscal year is \$441,500. Supervisor Plank moved to adopt Resolution No. 2001-R-24, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES OF FUNDS TO NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2001-02 for the sum of \$441,500. Supervisor Livermore and Williamson seconded the motion. Supervisor Williamson acknowledged that the Board has allocated a lot of General Fund monies to support non-profit organizations. She was unsure how Carson City's funding level compared with other communities. The organizations are found throughout the community and make the community a better place to live. She also hoped that the organizations make life better for all of the residents in the community. Mayor Masayko indicated that his perspective of the expenditures for non-profit organizations in surrounding counties indicated that Carson City is the easily the most forward looking and probably the most supportive by a long shot. This is something the Board has believed in and historically supported as money well spent. The motion to adopt Resolution No. 2001-R-24 was voted and carried 5-0.

There being no other matters for consideration, Supervisor Livermore moved to adjourn. Supervisor Williamson seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0. Mayor Masayko adjourned the meeting at 12:19 p.m.
